<u>MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS</u>: Candidates must meet the following requirements on or before the date of the written test:

Graduation from a regionally accredited or New York State registered college or university with a bachelor's degree in a human services field and one year of experience providing or coordinating health or human services to children with special needs.

<u>ALL CANDIDATES MUST SUBMIT A COPY OF THEIR COLLEGE TRANSCRIPT AT TIME OF</u> <u>APPLICATION.</u>

<u>NOTE</u>: A degree in a "human services field" includes social work, psychology, nursing, rehabilitation, special education, occupational or physical therapy, child or family counseling, and community mental health.

<u>SPECIAL REQUIREMENT</u>: Appointees will be required to possess a valid license to operate a motor vehicle in New York State or otherwise demonstrate their ability to meet transportation needs of the job.

<u>NOTE</u>: Finger printing may be required for this position. Any fee will be paid by the applicant.

EXAMPLES OF WORK: (illustrative only)

- Provides service coordination for early intervention services for identified children with developmental delays and disabilities ages 0-2;
- Makes home visits to collect information to assess need for and appropriate services for referred families using standardized evaluation measures;
- Assists families to develop Individual Family Service Plans which may include a variety of services such as health or psychological assessments, speech therapy, physical therapy, medical treatment, Medicaid assistance, parenting education, social services, etc.;
- Ensures the Individual Family Service Plan outcomes and strategies reflect the family's priorities, concerns, and resources, and that changes are made as the family's priorities, concerns and resources change;
- Maintains liaison with various agencies which provide early intervention services;
- Coordinates and attends meetings with families and providers of services to children;
- Facilitates the development of a transition plan to preschool services where appropriate;
- Works closely with maternal and child health staff to identify, at the earliest time, infants in need of evaluation and service;
- Serves as an advocate for families by helping them to obtain appropriate social, financial and medical services available through public and private agencies;
- Arranges third party payment for services to families where appropriate;
- Evaluates families in program to determine continued eligibility for program services and appropriateness of Individual Family Services Plans;
- May conduct presentations to local parent groups and other community forums to increase public awareness of early intervention services;
- Prepares and maintains a variety of records and reports.

<u>SCOPE OF EXAMINATION</u>: Written test will cover knowledge, skills, and/or abilities in such areas as:

Preparing written material

These questions test for the ability to present information clearly and accurately, and to organize paragraphs logically and comprehensibly. For some questions, you will be given information in two or three sentences followed by four restatements of the information. You must then choose the best version. For other questions, you will be given paragraphs with their sentences out of order. You must then choose, from four suggestions, the best order for the sentences.

Principles and practices of social casework

These questions test for knowledge of the principles and practices used to provide casework services to individuals and/or families of all ages, backgrounds, and circumstances. Questions will test for application of this knowledge in various settings and will include such topics as assessment, monitoring and evaluating services, counseling, referrals, and advocacy.

Working with individuals to promote mental health

These questions test for knowledge of characteristics, causes and treatment methods associated with working with individuals who may have mental, developmental, physical, social and substance abuse disorders and/or disabilities. Questions cover such topics as establishing, maintaining and terminating client relationships; recognizing, interpreting, and responding to individual and group behaviors, as well as crisis situations; and facilitating access to essential services such as financial, housing, medical, educational, legal, vocational, and recreational.

Interviewing

These questions test for knowledge of the principles and practices employed in obtaining information from individuals through structured conversations. These questions require you to apply the principles, practices, and techniques of effective interviewing to hypothetical interviewing situations. Included are questions that present a problem arising from an interviewing situation, and you must choose the most appropriate course of action to take.

Test guide:

The New York State Department of Civil Service has not prepared a test guide for this examination. However, candidates may find information in the publication 'General Guide to Written Tests' helpful in preparing for this test.
